- Aging Adult Services - This partner provides services to older adults so they can live independently. You will have the opportunity to connect with residents by sharing stories, assisting in everyday tasks, doing simple repairs, and more.
- Community Outreach Program - Partnering with this ministry means you may get to play soccer with neighborhood kids of diverse backgrounds, prepare lunch for community residents, or even decorate sidewalks with chalk messages to encourage others.
