Bring your swimsuits if you're worried about modesty. Everyone will be sleeping on floors, gender-separate, so bring your air-mattresses.

Home repairs of all sorts are planned for this Workcamp experience. This may include: building wheelchair ramps, strengthening porches, painting inside and out, and installing skirting. Throughout the Workcamp week, you will work alongside the Cosponsor to continue bettering homes that our local partners work with on a regular basis.
