Site Coach

Position Overview

The Site Coach provides encouragement and support to work crews at their sites and assists the Materials Manager in the management of tools and purchased materials. The responsibilities of the Site Coach include but are not limited to the following:

Site Coach Responsibilities

- Review all volunteer training resources provided online prior to camp
- Visit assigned worksites daily to provide encouragement and direction by being friendly and enthusiastic
- Give crews direction on proper work procedures, materials, tools, troubleshooting, and safety issues
- Act as a Safety Inspector. Make sure all sites are free from danger and participants are working safely
- Serve and support the Camp Director and Materials Manager by helping in these areas: tool and material room(s), material requests during check-in, daily material pick-up and delivery, staging materials for the next day, and tracking ladders and tools
- Work closely as a team with the Materials Manager, Crew Manager, other Site Coaches, and Local Project Advisors to monitor progress as sites and to ensure project completion
- Complete post-site inspections for each worksite thoroughly and accurately
- Commit to developing relationships with participants, Red Shirts, lodging facility staff, Cosponsors, and members of the community
- Attend nightly staff meetings

Physical Requirements

- Able to lift objects up to 50 pounds
- Capable of working (walking, standing, sitting, etc.) for 10-14 hours per day
- Prepared to work busy camp days with an average of 5-6 hours of sleep per night
